SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

The Artisans Fair, the main fund-raiser for our college scholarship fund, was again a big success. We raised \$9,594 after all expenses were paid, a \$1,103 increase over 2024. The weather was ideal, which resulted in great attendance. The reviews from the exhibitors were very positive and members of the community had a wonderful event to attend.

It is not too soon to start thinking about next year's Artisans Fair, which will be held Saturday, May 23, 2026 at Lord Baltimore Elementary School in Ocean View. We need volunteers for the planning committee, particularly in the area of exhibitor coordination, publicity and overall administration. In 2025, we will give a total of \$9,000 in scholarships – two \$1,500 scholarships to Indian River High School students and \$6,000 to adult students 25 years and older at Delaware Technical and Community College. Two of the Del-Tech scholarships are designated for nursing students, one scholarship goes to a student studying in a medically related field, and an additional scholarship goes to a student studying in any area of study.

CHAPTER TRIPS 2026

May 4-8 Holland Tulip Festival Overview:

New

It's Tulip Time, the Holland, Michigan festival that boasts over 5 million tulips, planted & ready to burst forth in bloom in early spring. The City of Holland manages all the tulip plantings in parks, along city streets and in the downtown area. Our tour will take us to the Neli's Dutch Village NL in Holland, Michigan is a really quaint little village! Walking through the charming streets of this Dutch Village while exploring the windmills, canals, and cozy houses make you feel transported to the Netherlands. We will visit DeKlomp Wooden shoes and Delft Factory: wooden shoes are a very practical footwear for gardening, getting the mail, and general use. See the shoemaker produce wooden shoes from block of poplar wood using authentic Dutch machinery (still used in Europe today). Delftware a Dutch pottery famous around the world; takes almost a full week to produce. They are the only production facility in North America, offering over 400 different hand painted Dutch pottery items. Follow the process of making these fine pottery items; from pouring the liquid clay into molds, to firing the clay at 2,000 degrees. Then talk to the artists as they hand paint Dutch designs and glaze each item for the perfect shine. No stop in Holland is complete without a visit to Windmill Island Gardens. Tour De Zwaan, the only authentic Dutch windmill operating in the United States – still turning and grinding wheat into flour! Other Dutch treasures include a street organ gifted by the City of Amsterdam and a hand-painted antique carousel. Other Dutch features include stately Friesian horses, a water exhibit and Little Netherlands – a maguette of Dutch life in the 1840s when Holland was settled. Many buildings are replicas of those found in the Netherlands including the ones housing a gift shop where you can pick up an authentic Dutch treat! We will finish up our trip with a great variety show in town for a relaxing evening.

AUGUST 4-7 New York's Thousand Islands

This trip takes us up to the 1,000 Islands. We will visit the Eisenhower Locks to discover the seaway's history on the St. Lawrence Seaway which separates the United States and Canada. You will learn the history through cutting-edge, hands-on interactive viewing decks. We will watch vessels pass through the U.S. Eisenhower Lock up close from two separate outdoor viewing decks. We will travel on to the Clayton Island Boat Tours for a unique cruise of the 1000 Islands along the St. Lawrence Seaway. The natural beauty of the less inhabited islands with tranquil bays, marshes, and scenic shorelines as we discover birds and wildlife that inhabit the region. However, our trip wouldn't be complete without a visit to the Thousand Islands Winery for a tasting of their wines. Each night we will return to the Edgewood Resort on the St. Lawrence River where you will taste fabulous dinners by the resort


