COMMITTEE NEWS

Scholarship

For the first time in 16 years that the Artisans Fair has been held, it rained. While many of our outside exhibitors cancelled because of the weather, four stayed at the fair. We relocated those four exhibitors closer to the buildings at Lord Baltimore Elementary School. Almost all of the indoor and outdoor exhibitors said they had a very successful show...some said it was the best ever. Thank you to all the volunteers, especially the parking volunteers who had to endure the wet conditions. Held May 23, this year's Artisans Fair was a very successful event for the Scholarship Committee. After all expenses were paid, we made \$10,271 for the scholarship fund. This was a \$677 increase over the 2025 show and a \$1,780 increase over 2024. This year, we will once again give away \$9,000 in scholarships—two \$1,500 scholarships to Indian River High School students and \$6,000 to adult students 25 years and older at Delaware Technical and Community College. Two of the Del-Tech scholarships are designated for nursing students, one scholarship goes to a student studying in a medically related field, and an additional scholarship goes to a person in any area of study. The Scholarship Committee is planning a fall Dine and Donate event and basket auction. Look for more details in the October newsletter.
